

The general arrangement and production of the book is superb, and as regards both *La Chaîne du Mont Blanc* and *Les Panoramas du Mont Blanc*, we would say to all mountaineers, 'Go to the book-shop.'

In one respect, however, both books are deficient: the indexes are miserably inadequate. Italian critics may with truth complain that the southern slopes are badly neglected. For this neglect the insanities of their own Government and frontier guards are mainly responsible.

May we trust that both works are only precursors to others similar on the French Alps? The publishers of II. will find better material nearer home.

With guide and a rope, the spikes of the country and an iron-tipped stick he traversed the Nigard glaciers for about three miles and subsequently pushed northwards to see two large glaciers which he said had never been visited by travellers.'

The ancients (unaffected by modern sentiment) seem to have thought them hideous waste obstacles on the earthly face—as just a view, perhaps, as the other."'

'The ascent of Mont Blanc was first produced by him as a public entertainment on March 15, 1852. The interest excited in the achievement itself was sufficient to ensure him a large and attentive audience: but when to this was added his ability as a lecturer, his genuine humour, with his careful attention to the comfort of his audience, to enable him to achieve an unprecedented success, so that every English man or woman, boy or girl, has been able to do the ascent of Mont Blanc by deputy, and to realise it to him or herself pretty nearly as completely as if he or she had climbed upon its snowy side, and had sat upon its summit.

The ascent of Mont Blanc has continued to be one of the most popular favourites down to the present time (June 1858): Mr. Smith's readiness in adapting and embodying into its performance the most witty allusions to the events of the day—a charm which forms a considerable portion of its attractiveness to the multitude. Ever fresh and new in its details, though year after year the same in its general outlines, the ascent of Mont Blanc has succeeded in drawing up daily, throughout the season, at the doors of the Egyptian Hall, a string of carriages of the titled and untitled aristocracy, such as would not disgrace the doors of the Opera House on the night when Albani or Piccolomini are announced. It was visited by Prince Albert in 1853: by her Majesty and the Royal children in 1854: and represented privately at Osborne in 1855: and at Windsor Castle in 1856 before the Royal Family and the King of the Belgians.

* Except for a month's vacation in every year, this indefatigable gentleman has never relaxed his labours since Mont Blanc was first started. Nine times in every succeeding week he has gone through his entertainment and sung his songs.'

To the President of the British Board of Film Censors.

SIR,—I beg to inquire on behalf of the President and Members of the Alpine Club, whether you could see your way to prevent the film entitled *The Fight for the Matterhorn* from being exhibited in this country.

Many relatives of those who perished in the accident of 1865 are still alive, not only in this country but also in Switzerland and Italy, and the representation of the said accident, as also the story
